1. Introduction

Established in 2018, NeuGen Fund (“NeuGen”) * is a registered charity set to empower the children and families of reformed offenders to prevent intergenerational offending. The charity is currently an Institution of a Public Character (IPC).

Through various academic and pro-social initiatives under the Neu Empowerment Model, we actively engage our beneficiaries to minimise the impact of parental incarceration on the children’s overall wellbeing.

Over the years, we have impacted the lives of over 1,600 children and 800 families through these initiatives and we are only able to do so with the support of our external stakeholders, including volunteers. NeuGen relies on the experience, talents, and passion of its volunteers in many aspects of work and are immensely grateful for their contribution.

2. Our Vision, Mission and Approach

Vision:

A caring and inclusive society where lives are rebuilt to be productive and self-reliant.

Mission:

As a charity, we provide holistic and empathetic support to reformed offenders, their children, and families to prevent intergenerational offending.

Approach:

In 2021, we initiated a process of reviewing our programme framework and approach, to be more proactive and impactful in empowering a new generation of children – one of self-determination and unconstrained futures. In July 2022, we adopted the name “NeuGen” and introduced the **Neu Empowerment Model** with pillars focusing on education, personal development, holistic growth, family and home environmental needs. Children are the future of the world and with our tagline ‘New Lives New Futures’, we hope to embark on a journey of empowerment with each of them!

3. Why Volunteer with NeuGen?

From time to time, NeuGen organises events and workshops such as Family Day and Bursary Award that require volunteers to take on supporting roles like ushers, game masters, emcee, and photographers.

If you are looking at a longer-term volunteering with minimum 1 year commitment, feel free to express interest in becoming a mentor for our children, facilitating support groups for mothers and caregivers and others. Do take note that these roles are on a need's basis.

5. Support, Guidance & Training

Orientation & Training

After receiving registration, we will arrange for every volunteer to go through orientation to better understand our organisation and the scope of work.

We will also keep a lookout for suitable training opportunities to equip volunteers with relevant skill sets throughout the year.

6. Rights and Responsibilities of Volunteers

As a volunteer, you have the right to:

- Be respected and valued
- Be in a safe and friendly environment
- Be educated with all the necessary information need to carry out your tasks

As a volunteer, you have the responsibility to:

- Be genuine and a good listener to our beneficiaries
- Be respectful to all
- Be empathetic, but not gullible
- Be objective and avoid bias
- Be trustworthy

7. Exit Interview

For volunteers who would like to end their volunteering journey with us, it is our procedure to conduct an exit interview to gain feedback on the volunteering experience and to ensure a proper handover (if any).

8. Representation to the media

It is important that NeuGen speaks with only one consistent voice.

Media or any external party might ask for your opinions as a NeuGen volunteer. Instead of commenting, please refer them to our Communications & External Relations (CER) team to follow up with them.

If you decide to comment, please ensure that the media and other external party understand that they are coming from your own personal capacity to share. After the interview, you should update the CER team with the details of your interview.
